Rock Hill Wins National America's Promise Award: Named in 100 Best Communities for Young People

America's Promise Alliance (the Alliance), the nation's largest alliance dedicated to children and youth, in partnership with Capital One, announced that Rock Hill has been named a winner of its 2008 100 Best Communities for Young People (100 Best) competition. The 100 Best competition recognizes the 100 outstanding communities across America—large and small, rural and urban—that are the best places for young people to live and grow up. More than 300 communities in all 50 states applied for the honor this year. This is the second time Rock Hill has received this honor, as the city was also named a 100 Best Community in 2006.

Rock Hill was chosen as one of the 100 Best because of the community's commitment to improving the lives of its young people. A number of Rock Hill organizations collaborated on the application, featuring programs sponsored by various

between children and adults supporting academic performance, self confidence, new experiences, improved school community links, and improved sense of connectedness to the school community.

In addition, United Way Impact Teams gathered information for a 10 year plan addressing issues in Education, Families, Health and Wellness, and Basic Needs. The United Way survey found that 85% could not find help for identified needs. With \$35,000 United Way has funded "2-1-1" creating a direct response line to help a family member, a friend, or self 24/7.

The Rock Hill City Council is working with the Rock Hill Commission for Children and Youth on the awareness campaign known as "The Number One Question . . . Is It Good for the Children?" The goal of this initiative is

to help our community become more aware of the many positive youth resources

that currently exist and to help our community recognize the impact of the decisions they make daily and how those decisions ultimately affect the children and youth of Rock Hill.

"We all understand that our young people represent the future of our community," said Rock Hill Mayor Doug Echols. "For us as a city to receive this national recognition is another step forward in recognizing the many good things that happen in Rock Hill to support children and youth."

The 100 Best competition was first held in 2006. All communities that completed entries in the 100 Best competition were required to submit detailed information to the Alliance on existing community programs and initiatives that help deliver the Five Promises—resources identified by America's Promise as being critical to the development of healthy, successful children: caring adults; safe places; healthy start; effective education; and opportunities to help others.

City of Rock Hill Streamlines Customer Service Phone System

After many months of planning, the City of Rock Hill has installed new telephone software that will help direct customers to the appropriate party or department. The system works through a series of automated prompts in the Citizen Service Center.

The number to call in most instances is 803/325-2500. If you're not sure exactly whom you need to speak with, this number can connect you with a City of Rock Hill representative during normal business hours, Monday through Friday, 7:30 am until 5:15 pm.

"We believe the new system will allow customers to get assistance more quickly, enhancing the customer service level we offer our citizens," said Rock Hill City Manager Carey Smith.

For customers who want to report problems or pay their utility bills 24 hours a day through the Interactive Voice Response (IVR) system, the number to call is 803/329-5500. To access the IVR system, be sure you have the phone number the City has on file for your account.

Utility accounts may also be accessed on the web at www.cityofrockhill.com. To access your account on the website, you must have your account number and a 4-digit PIN number which (if you don't have one) you may get from the Customer Service Center at 803/325-2500 during normal business hours.

REMEMBER:

If you need to call a specific department in the City of Rock Hill for any purpose, particularly if you want to talk to a real person, call **803/325-2500**.

If you want to report a power outage or utilize the automated Interactive Voice Response service (IVR), call **803/329-5500**.
